



Garden

For this work, you will need;

- 1/ One or more sheets of steel (not stainless) of a reasonably slight thickness, say 0.8 mm
- 2/ Oil based gloss household paint, in the colour of your choice.
- 3/ A means of applying afore-mentioned paint to steel; the more professional the finish, the better. Ideally the work should be professionally sprayed if your means run to it.
- 4/ Paint stripper, preferably yellow Nitromors.
- 5/ Salt
- 6/ Sheets of absorbent cloth as large as the work.
- 7/ Water, copious amounts of.
- 8/ Turpentine
- 9/ A well ventilated space.

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Instructions for Use

- 1/ Paint/roll/spray the paint onto the steel.
- 2/ Leave to dry.
- 3/ Brush on the nitromors, and then neutralise with turps when the desired de-materialisation has occurred.
- 4/ Cover in salt, and then wrap in damp cloth for a number of weeks. Keep re-watering until the envisioned amount of rust has developed.

Stage 4 should take about 2 months. If everything seems to be taking too damn long, add more salt.

Exhibiting 'Garden'

- Either; Turf a room, lean sheets against wall, and add a sprinkler or watering can in the middle of the room. Ask people to take off shoes when entering the room. Ideally, the sheets should be six foot high and three feet wide if this version is attempted.
- Or; Buy assorted sizes, and attach to wall in a random loose grid
- Or; Just attach to wall using mirror plates as normal.
